Education being a holistic development, it becomes extremely important to teach students about their citizen’s rights and duties towards the country. The responsibility of the youth is not only to elect and select but also to provide right leadership. Therefore, this year being the year of the Vidhan Sabha elections of Madhya Pradesh and the Lok Sabha elections as well many programs focusing on voters’ awareness were organized by the college.



The first event being a Voters Awareness Rally which started after a brief program in the college and proceeded to the city with students shouting slogans, and encouraging the masses to vote and participate in the forthcoming Vidhan Sabha elections of Madhya Pradesh. The citizens of Sehore city gave a warm response to the campaign. The second event was the formation of a human chain to raise awareness on voting rights and duties. Wide participation from all the sections of the society students, teachers, workers, etc. was seen.

In another program, the students went to Amlaha toll check post and made a five km. long rangoli exhibiting colorful messages for the passer-by in vehicles especially, Truck and Auto drivers, Bus drivers and passengers encouraging each and every passer by to exercise their voting rights. Above 200 students participated in this program.



During a special week-long residential camp by our NSS girls unit at village Pachama, voters awareness activities were a regular feature in the evening sessions. Girls staged plays and sang songs about the role of voting in democratic countries and they also told the villagers about their duties and responsibilities as voters in nation building. These activities were highly appreciated by the villagers.



A slogan writing competition was held for college students in which the students came up with interesting and creative slogans related to voting, democracy, role of voters and political leadership etc. An Oath taking program was held in which the district collector Mr. Pithode (IAS) conducted the oath tacking ceremony where students took oath that they shall surely vote and full fill their responsibility as citizens of India. Voter cards were also distributed to students above 18 years of age. About 200 students took the oath.
